CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

The Association for the Study of Religion in Southern Africa (ASRSA) in collaboration with the Department of Religion Studies at the University of Johannesburg is pleased to announce the "Call for Submissions" for the 37th ASRSA Congress. This year's congress will be held at the University of Johannesburg, Kingsway Campus. The theme identified for this year's congress is "Religious" Violence and / or Violence in the Name of Religion". In the past decade, we have seen discourses of "religious violence" and "violence in the name of religion" dominate much of the global agenda. These discourses have also taken center stage within the academe, with scholarship and research repositioning the discourse within a broader interdisciplinary milieu. In addition, there has been an increase in public interest with new media (such as social networks) emerging as a contested space for dialogue and debate. Based on the growing interest of this niche, the 2015 ASRSA Congress organizers are glad to announce this call for submissions, inviting researchers and scholars to present and share their findings and experiences on the chosen theme. Researchers and scholars working within this niche have explored a myriad of ways in which religion intersects with violence, such as historical, political, economic, legal, psychological, identities, norms, practices, gender, literature, and new media, etc. This 37th ASRSA congress will provide opportunities for careful and focused discussion of these and many more related issues. We invite submissions that seek to address the following congress tracks (but not limited to these):

Track 1: Foundational Texts (extent to which violence is embedded in Religious Texts)

Track 2: Media Representations of Religion and Violence

Track 3: Regional Studies (East, West, North and Southern Africa)

Track 4: Shifting Gender Constructs in Religious Discourses of Violence

Track 5: Role of States in Religious Discourses of Violence



PRESENTATION TYPES

We welcome proposals within the following presentation structures:

- Paper Presentation: Single paper presentation (prepared by one or more authors). Time allocated: 20 minutes presentation and 10 minutes discussion
- Poster Presentations: Displays may be in the form of posters (maximum 121.92 x 91.44 cm/4 x 3 feet), digital/ computer displays, or other visual media. Each display should include a brief abstract of the purpose and procedures of the work; handouts or copies of written material may also be available. Space for the presentation will be provided by the congress organizers. All other materials including posters, displays, handouts or other appropriate materials are the responsibility of the presenter.
- Colloquium: This congress session is scheduled for 90-120 minutes and involves several
 presenters who are proposing a set of papers based on a shared theme or topic. Presenters
 should conceive and design the session to allow for time for individual presentations and time
 for engagement with conference attendees.
- Pecha Kucha: These are short presentations, approximately 10 slides at 1 minute per slide
 within an allocated time of 10 minutes. The aim of this presentation type is to keep the flow
 concise and fast-paced.

- 2. Institutional Affiliation of Author/s
- 3. Email Address of Author/s
- 4. Title (not more than 15 words)
- 5. Abstract (minimum 350 maximum 500 words)
- 6. Keywords (minimum 3 maximum 6)
- 7. Conference Track
- 8. Presentation Type


ACCOMODATION LISTING

MAP: DIRECTIONS TO UNIVERSITY OF JOHANNESBURG



From Johannesburg South: Travel on the M1 North, take the Empire Rd. off-ramp and turn left into Empire Rd. (the off-ramp before Empire is Smit Str.)

From Johannesburg North / Sandton / Pretoria: Travel on the M1 South, take the Empire Road off-ramp and turn right into Empire Rd. (the off-ramp before Empire is Jan Smuts Ave)

Once you have turned into Empire Rd: Keep to the middle lane until you passed the Holiday Inn. Keep on going until you get to the Annet / Kingsway T-junction (please note that the cross roads on Stanley is not indicated on the MAP). Turn right into Kingsway. Approximately 1km further the UJ will be on your left.
